CITY OF IDA GROVE COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES **TUESDAY, SEPT. 18, 2023** 5:30 p.m.

TEMPORARY CITY HALL 311 BARNES STREET

1. Call to Order: Mayor Protem, Gregor Ernst, called the meeting to order at 5:31 p.m.

2. Roll Call: Present: Gregor Ernst, Jeff Miesner & Jason Schable. Ange Johnson & Jared Bogue were absent. Mayor, Nathan Weitl, was also absent.

3. Approval of Agenda: Motion by Schable second by Miesner to approve. Motion carried 3-0.

4. Corey Trucke - EMS Ballot Information: Trucke provided detailed information to council regarding the Nov. 7 EMS ballot question. Iowa Code 422D allows for a taxing authority of .75/\$1000 valuation for EMS support, but requires a passing public vote of a minimum of 60%. Trucke explained the passage of this vote is vital to Ida County in that it would provide funding for service support, education/training, equipment and staffing. The idea would be to hire advanced level responders that would be available 24/7, rather than the current Monday through Friday, 8-5. Trucke noted that due to the amount of calls for help and lack of volunteers, some response times have been upwards of 40 minutes. There is a Town Hall Meeting scheduled for 7 p.m. on Sept. 26 at The Farmacy for anyone seeking additional information.

5. Ross Ladwig - Driveway Regulations: Ladwig explained a driveway permit application he submitted that is ineligible for approval, due to not meeting code requirements as the requested permit exceeds the maximum driveway width allowed for a 2-car garage. After review, council determined there is an argument to be made that the garage in question at 301 6th Street is wider than a standard 2-car garage. Council

all agreed the permit application for a 30-foot wide driveway at 301 6th Street could be approved as submitted.

6. Consent Agenda: Motion by Miesner, second by Schable to approve the consent agenda consisting of the following: Clerk's Report, claims in the amount of \$165,447.85, financial reports, minutes of the 9/5/2023 & 9/13/2023 meetings, permits and correspondence. Motion carried 3-0.

FY23 Urban Renewal 7. Report: Motion by Ernst, second by Miesner to approve. Motion carried 3-0

8. FY23 Annual Financial Report: Motion by Ernst, second by Schable to approve. Motion carried 3-0.

9. Resolution 2023-41 Setting Public Hearing Date for FY24 Budget Amendment #1: Motion by Miesner, second by Ernst to approve. Motion carried 3-0

10. Sargent Drilling - Well #7 Repairs: Motion by Schable, second by Miesner to approve Sargent Drilling's quote of \$23,208 for emergency repairs and maintenance to well #7. Motion carried 3-0.

11. City Council Member News & Notes: Mayor Weitl arrived at this time. Miesner inquired on the process to run additional water lines in Zobel's Addition. Schable asked about standards and inspections for contractors who pour concrete in the City Streets after projects, such as water/sewer digs. Weitl shared about interest from a local donor to develop a splash pad in City Park. City Staff will put in an Iowa One Call request to locate utilities and gather some additional information for future discussion.

12. Adjournment: Motion by Miesner, second by Schable to adjourn. Motion carried 3-0. Meeting adjourned at 6:41 p.m. Heather Sweeden, City Clerk Gregor Ernst, Mayor Protem

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
