April 11, 2023, at 6 p.m. at the Community Hall. Mayor Pierce presided over the meeting. Council

members present: Jary Vermeys,

Myra Meek, Jeanette Holmes, and Jill Wingert. Kevin Dausel was absent.

Mayor Pierce called the meeting

to order. Motion by Vermeys, seconded by Holmes to approve the agenda and meeting minutes.

Motion carried.

Mayor Pierce opened the public hearing at 6 p.m. on the FY24 Budget. The public hearing was closed at 6:11 with no public

comment received. Motion to approve Resolution 2023-05 by Wingert, seconded by Meek to approve the budget as published.

Motion carried.

Motion by Vermeys, seconded by Meek to accept the bid from

Johnson Propane for a new heat/ cooling unit for the community hall

Roger Kropf was present

at a cost of \$12,900. Motion carried. to discuss concerns over the

discolored water at his residence.

The city did experience a 4" main break and the fire trucks had

filled their tanker often in the past few weeks due to fire calls and controlled burns. Craig explained what he does for testing and what

what he does to help control the rust in the water. Residents are encouraged to direct their issues/ concerns with city water to Craig,

Water Superintendent, in the future.

At 6:30, the mayor opened the rezoning hearing. Jody Jepsen requested rezoning of his property along Clara Street from residential to commercial. Several property

owners were present to voice their concerns along with one letter received against the rezoning. The mayor closed the public hearing at 6:47. Motion by Vermeys, seconded by Wingert to deny Jepsen's

request to rezone. Motion carried. . Pat Stevens, Ambulance, reported on his department. They are holding an Omelet Breakfast

Fundraiser at the Fire Station on April 23rd and they are conducting

a raffle for a 3-night fishing trip. An update on nuisances was reported.

The city council set the date of Saturday, June 10 for City Wide

Clean Up.

Battle Creek Library will be holding a game night on Tuesday,

April 18. The Clerk asked the council to review a new building permit application and changes were

recommended.

Wingert to approve the renewal of liquor license for Sparky's. Motion

carried.

bills. Motion carried.

Motion by Vermeys, seconded by Meek to approve a building permit for 507 Maple – 34' x 54' shed. Motion carried.
